As an initial measure towards resolution of the age- old tradition heritage and general upliftmen of monasteries the erstwhile Government approved and establishment of 49 number of monastery schools each with one adhoc teacher at the rate of Rs 1000 per month and Rs 5000 per annum maintenance cost. The expense is being made under the vocational training scheme of the Education Department through the Ecclesiastical Department. Public Enthusiasm and encouragement towards these monastic schools have been immense. Considerable increase in enrolment of student every year and subsequent increase in demands for additional teacher, school holidays etc. has rendered existing infrastructure acute and inadequate. Hence it is resolved that this House urges the State government to include these monastic school in category of other government school, education institutions and to provide equivalent fund provision to bring them at par.
